The Oak Grove School District Education Foundation was established in 2017 with the mission of "Leaving a Legacy." The Oak Grove School District Education Foundation is a charitable organization that supports and celebrates excellence in education by providing financial resources to stimulate learning for students, teachers, and programs beyond the scope of the School District regular budget.

The Education Foundation promotes excellence in education by helping provide scholarships to graduating seniors, enhancing classrooms through teacher grants, and hopefully in the future assisting the schools in purchasing items and providing new initiatives for the district.

The Foundation is funded through private donations from individuals, local businesses, and partnership activities that enhance education for Oak Grove students.

Like nearly all the Education Foundations in the Kansas City area, we partnered with the Truman Heartland Community Foundation to take advantage of pooled investments along with retaining the expertise of their accountants, legal advisers, and planned giving specialists to further assist donors.
